Inculcation in them love of tradition and respect for the traditional values of *Dev Bhoomi*



RAGGING IS A CRIMINAL OFFENCE

Ragging is a punishable offence. Ragging of all kind is strictly banned in the college campus. Anybody caught indulging in this evil exercise shall face penalty under the law. Act remotely suggestive of ragging should be reported to the college authorities/to the member of anti ragging committee. A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term, which may extend to three years or shall also be liable to a fine, which may extend to **Rs. 50,000 or both**.

In order to have zero tolerance and its total elimination from the educational institutions Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May, 2001; 16th May, 2007 and 11th Feb. 2009 has directed as under:

Ragging is banned in the institution. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh. Punishment for ragging includes:

- > Imprisonment, fine or both.
- > Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
 Debarring from representation in events.
- > Withholding of results.
- Suspension of expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.

BACHELOR OF COMPUTER APPLICATION (BCA)

Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) is three years under graduate course spread over six semesters under self financing scheme. The total number of seats in BCA Course is 40, distributed as follows:

ELIGIBILITY CONDITION FOR BCA

- a) 10+2 examination or any other examination equivalent thereto, of a Board/University established by law in India with 40% marks (35% for Scheduled Caste/Schedule Tribe Candidates).
- b) Any Examination of a Board/ University/ College/ School in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the purpose of eligibility by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalent Committee or on the recommendation of Association of Indian University, AIU House, 16 Kotla Marg New Delhi-110 002, with at least 40% marks(35% in case of SC/ST candidates).

AGE LIMIT FOR BCA

Maximum age limit for admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girl candidates, as on the 1_{st}July of the year concerned. The Vice- Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

Mode of Selection

The admission to BCA course will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination. As per H.P. University rules 75% seats will be filled out of the candidates who have passed their 10+2 examination from the school situated in Himachal Pradesh irrespective of the Board. Remaining 25% seats will be filled on all India basis. Other reservation rules of H.P. University shall be applicable.

Note:- Admission will be made as per the rules and guide lines of H.P.U. Shimla.

First 30 seats are subsidized and next 10 seats are non-subsidized in each category

Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) Scheme of Examination

- (a) Duration of BCA programme shall be of three years (or Six Semesters).
- b) There shall be an examination at the end of the Semester for which the dates will be notified bythe Controller of Examinations.
- c) The courses of study and syllabi shall be as pre-scribed by the Board of Studies/Faculty from time to time. Other rules will be similar to those for the corresponding examinations in the University.
 - (d) Pass percentage of marks: The pass marks in each paper shall be 40%
- e) A candidate obtaining pass marks in any course shall not be required to Re-appear in that course again, however, the candidate shall be required to complete his BCA degree within a maximum of five years.

English shall be medium of instruction and Examination:

In each theory paper Nine questions are to be divided into A, B, C, D and E sections. There will be two questions in each section A, B, C, D and section E is compulsory which will be of short answer type with 5 part based on entire syllabus. Students are required to attempt one question from each Part. In all five questions are to be attempted.

Note:- Internal Assessment will be given on the basis of class Tests, Assignment, Seminars and attendance in class.

There will be Semesters examination system. Odd Semester examination held in the month of Nov/Dec and Even Semester examination in the month of April/May.

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DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT

The Principal has power to take disciplinary action against student indulging in acts of indiscipline, which may lead to fine, suspension, rustication or expulsion.

The following activities will be considered as violation of the college discipline and may result in fine\ expulsion or rustication depending on the gravity of the offence:

IDENTITY CARD / LIBRARY CARD

Only two books are issued to a student at a time for a period of 14 days. Reference Books/ Dictionaries/ Newspapers/ Periodicals will not be issued. If the issued books are not returned by due date, a fine at the rate of Rs. 5 per book per day will be charged. Internal damage to a book will invite a fine of Rs. 50/-in addition to recovery of cost of the book. Failure to return the book or to pay the penalty imposed will entail the same procedure for recovery as in the case of recovery of govt. property.

LIBRARY AND IDENTITY CARD

A student may borrow a maximum of two at a time for a period of 10 days. At the expiry of this period, there is a fine per day , per book. Intentional damage to a book will invite a fine of Rs.50/- in addition to the recovery of the cost of the

book. Reference books and periodicals are not given on loan. Needless to say students are expected to maintain silence in the Reading Room and the Library. Library remains open on all working days from 10:00AM to 5:00 PM.

2.00/- per day.

IDENTITY CARD:-Soon after the admission to the college, the Librarian will issue a student an Identity and Library Card. It is mandatory for all students to have their Identity Card with them when they are in the college, and it must be produced when asked for by any member of the teaching staff. The Identity Card an important document and should be kept with care. A fine of Rs. 30.00/- will be charged for issuing a duplicate Identity Card.

The college has two NCC wings separately for boys and girls. Students have to apply while filling the online form for participation in NCC activities. Recruitment is done by selection. NCC teaches the students the lesson of study and discipline. A, B & C Certificates holder are eligible to appear directly for interview in the Armed Forces.

ROVERS AND RANGERS

The college has got one unit of Rovers and Rangers each. Basically it is a voluntary non-political youth organization wherein students are trained to combat during natural disaster and otherwise too. It helps its members to have all-round development and become perfect responsible individuals to the society, nation and the world at large.
