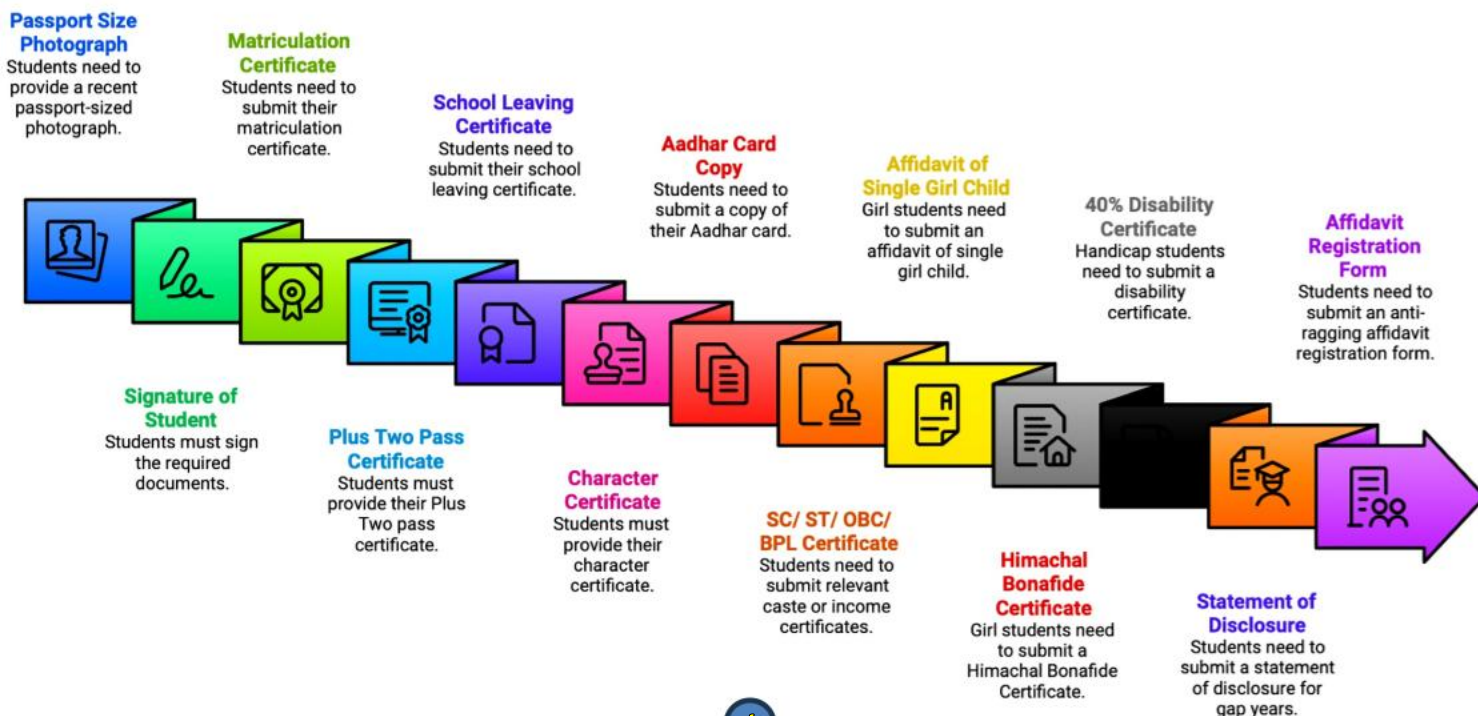

GENERAL ADMISSION RULES

- **Maximum age: 23 years** for candidates seeking admission to **B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. First Semester** as on **1st July, 2026**.
- **Girl students:** Upper age limit is **25 years**.
- **SC/ST candidates:** Eligible for **3 years' relaxation** in the upper age limit as per University rules.
- **Vice-Chancellor, HPU Shimla:** May grant additional age relaxation up to **6 months** in deserving cases.
- Age relaxation cases may be **provisionally recommended by the Principal** and forwarded to the Vice-Chancellor for approval.
- A candidate granted age relaxation at the time of first admission shall remain eligible for the **same relaxation in subsequent classes/semesters**, subject to University regulations.

ELIGIBILITY FOR UG PROGRAMMES

Candidates must have passed **12th standard or an equivalent examination** from a **recognized institution**.

- ❑ Admission to **3-year/4-year UG programmes** will be based on the **preferred Major subject or chosen subject combinations**.
- ❑ Admission to a **specific discipline/Major** is subject to **availability of seats and college capacity**.
- ❑ Students must fulfil the **prerequisites and eligibility conditions prescribed by the University** for admission to a particular programme.

ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS (ABC)

- The **Himachal Pradesh University – Undergraduate Programme (HPU-UGP)** is linked with the **Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)** system notified by the **UGC**.
- **Credits earned by students** after each examination will be **deposited in the ABC system** by the **University**.
- All students under **HPU-UGP** must **register for ABC** as per **UGC guidelines**.

INTER-INSTITUTION MOBILITY

The HPU-UGP enables students to engage in **inter-institutional mobility**, both for **incoming and outgoing students**. For this, HPU will take into account the credits that the student has in **their ABC**. For an incoming student, the following should be observed:

- ✓ The entry is subject to the **availability of seats** in the concerned discipline.
- ✓ The student must fulfil all the **academic prerequisites** of the relevant discipline.
- ✓ HPU will award a degree to a student only when the **student has completed at least 60% of the credits** for core courses offered by HPU.

- Students exiting after **Year 1 or Year 2** can re-enter only into the **same programme**.

SIGNIFICANT NOTES WITH REFERENCE TO THE CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK FOR UNDERGRADUATE (UG) PROGRAMMES, HIMACHAL PRADESH UNIVERSITY

- **Credit Structure:** Prescribed credits include **Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical** components.
- **Subject Selection:** In **Semester I**, students will study **three subjects (A, B, and C)** within the same stream.
- **Programme Choice:** At the end of **Semester II**, students can choose either:
 - **Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary Programme, or**
 - **Single Core Discipline (Major) Programme**
- **Major & Minor Selection:** Students opting for the **Major Programme** must select their **Major and Minor disciplines**, which will continue till **Semester VI**.
- **Additional Seats:** Colleges may create **10% extra seats** for students requesting a **change of Major**, with preference based on **higher CGPA and no arrears**.
 - **Minor Courses:**
 - DSCs of another discipline may be treated as **Minor courses**.
 - Students may choose **Minor courses from two subjects**, with a minimum of **12 credits in each**.
- **MDC Selection: Multidisciplinary Courses (MDCs)** must be chosen from subjects **other than Major and Minor disciplines**.
 - **SEC / AEC / VAC Courses:**
 - SEC, AEC, and VAC courses will be selected from an approved course pool.
 - **SEC-1 and SEC-2** must be selected from **discipline-specific Core/Minor subjects**.
- **Language Courses:** Students can opt for a maximum of **two language courses** as Core/Minor, while **AEC language courses** must differ from DSC/Minor subjects.
- **Internship/Project (I/A/P/C):** Activities will be decided after **Semester I** for completion during **winter vacation**.
 - **Honours / Honours with Research Eligibility:**
 - Students must complete a **3-year UG Degree** successfully.
 - Must study **one discipline only** in the 4th year.
 - **75% or above aggregate marks up to Semester VI** are required for **Honours with Research** (subject to HPU approval).

Permissible Subjects and Subject Combinations for B.A. (Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences)

Student Guide: How to Choose Your 6 Subject Combinations

Subject Preference Selection

- Students are required to submit **6 different subject preferences (combinations)**.
- Out of these 6 preferences, **only one combination** will be allotted on the basis of **admission merit**.
- Each preference consists of three courses: **DSC A, DSC B, and DSC C**.

To make your choices, you will use the following 5 Subject Baskets:

Basket Number	Available Subjects
Basket 1	English, Hindi, Sanskrit
Basket 2	Political Science, Geography, Public Administration
Basket 3	History, Education, Maths
Basket 4	Physical Education, Music (I), Music (V)
Basket 5	Economics, Sociology, Journalism & Mass Communication (JMC)

Note : Seat Limits: 30 seats for DSC A, 30 seats for DSC B, and 20 seats for DSC C per subject.

The 3 Golden Rules of Selection

When building your 6 preferences, you must strictly follow these three rules. If you break them, the software will not accept your combination.

1. The Basket Rule (No Overlap within a Preference) Within any single preference, all three of your subjects (DSC A, B, and C) must come from **different baskets**. Once you pick a subject from a basket, that entire basket is "locked" for the rest of that specific preference.

2. The Slot Rule (No Repeating the Same Position) You cannot place the same subject in the exact same slot across different preferences.

For example, if you choose History as your **DSC A** in Preference 1, you can never put History in the **DSC A** slot for Preferences 2, 3, 4, 5, or 6. You must move it to DSC B or C if you want to use it again.

3. The "Two-Time" Global Limit You can only select a specific subject a maximum of **two times** across all your 6 preferences combined.

Once you have used a subject twice (e.g., once as DSC A and once as DSC B), it will permanently disappear from your dropdown menus.

Examples of VALID Combinations

Here is a perfect example of how a student can map out all 6 preferences successfully without breaking any rules:

- **Preference 1:** History (Basket 3) – English (Basket 1) – Sociology (Basket 5)
- **Preference 2:** Political Science (Basket 2)–Sociology (Basket 5)– English (Basket 1)
- **Preference 3:** Economics (Basket 5) – History (Basket 3) – Political Science (Basket 2)

(At this point, History, English, Sociology, and Political Science have hit their 2-time limit and are now locked.)

- **Preference 4:** Math (Basket 3) – Economics (Basket 5) – Sanskrit (Basket 1)
- **Preference 5:** Education (Basket 3) – Hindi (Basket 1) – Geography (Basket 2)
- **Preference 6:** Geography (Basket 2) – Education (Basket 3) – Hindi (Basket 1)

Why this works: No preference uses two subjects from the same basket. No subject is placed in the same column (DSC A, B, or C) twice. No single subject is used more than two times overall.

Invalid Example 1: Breaking the Basket Rule

- **Your Choice:** English – Hindi – History
- **Why it fails:** English and Hindi both belong to Basket 1. Once you pick English, Hindi disappears.

Invalid Example 2: Breaking the Slot Rule

- **Preference 1:** History (DSC A) – English (DSC B) – Sociology (DSC C)
- **Preference 2:** History (DSC A) – Political Science (DSC B) – Sanskrit (DSC C)
- **Why it fails:** You cannot put History in the "DSC A" position twice. In Preference 2, History must be moved to DSC B or DSC C.

Invalid Example 3: Breaking the Two-Time Limit Rule

- **Preference 1:** History (DSC A) – English (DSC B) – Political Science (DSC C)
- **Preference 2:** Political Science (DSC A) – History (DSC B) – Economics (DSC C)
- **Preference 3:** Economics (DSC A) – Hindi (DSC B) – History (DSC C)
- **Why it fails:** You attempted to pick History three times. After Preference 2, History reaches its maximum limit and cannot be chosen for Preference 3.

SEC, AEC and MDC Subject Allocation:

- **SEC Subject Allocation:** Your assigned SEC-I (Skill Enhancement Course) subject in 1st Semester will automatically correspond to the DSC A subject allotted to you and SEC-II subject in 2nd Semester will automatically correspond to the DSC B subject. SEC -III will be granted by the college next year.
- **AEC and MDC Subject Allocation:** AEC (Ability Enhancement Course) and MDC (Multidisciplinary Course) subjects will be assigned manually (offline). Students will be notified of these specific allotments within one week following the completion of the admission process.

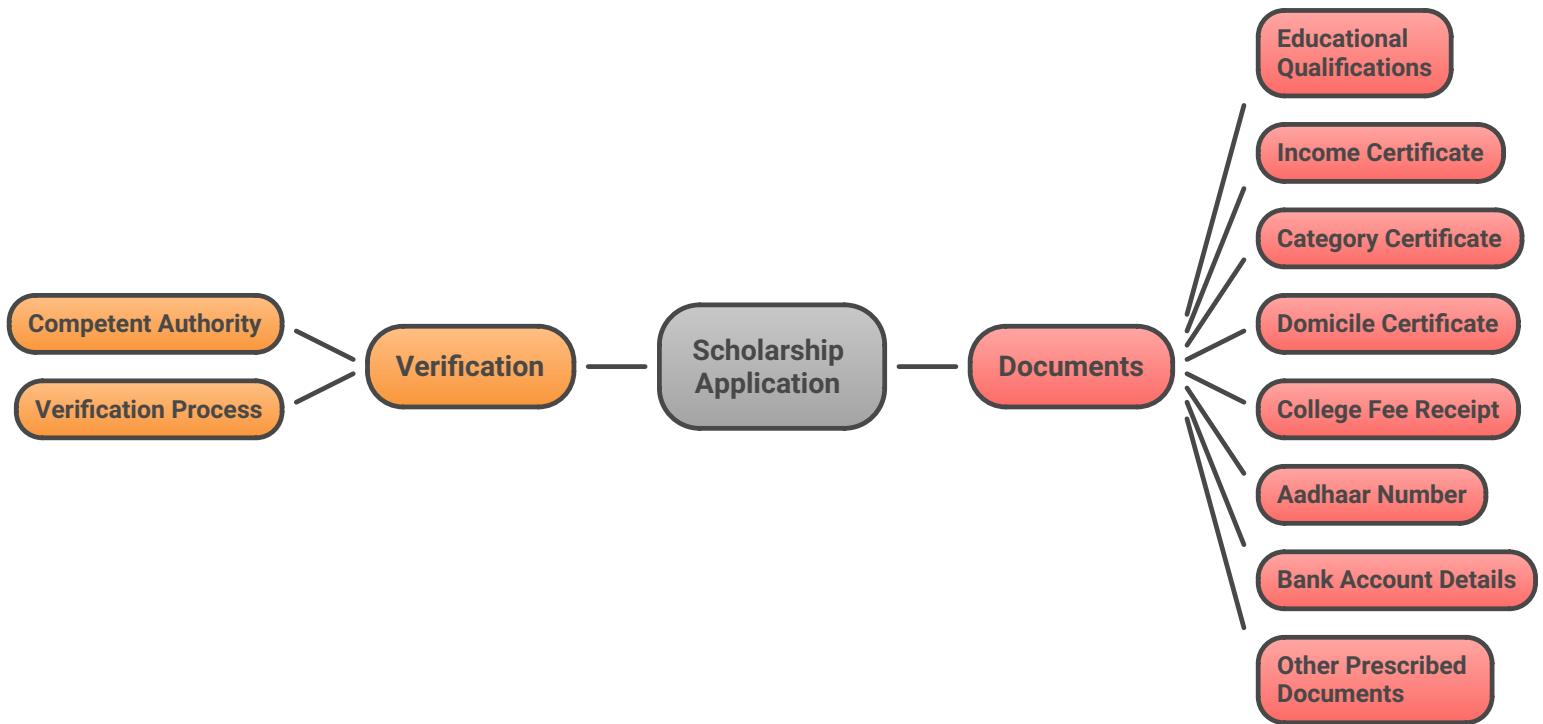

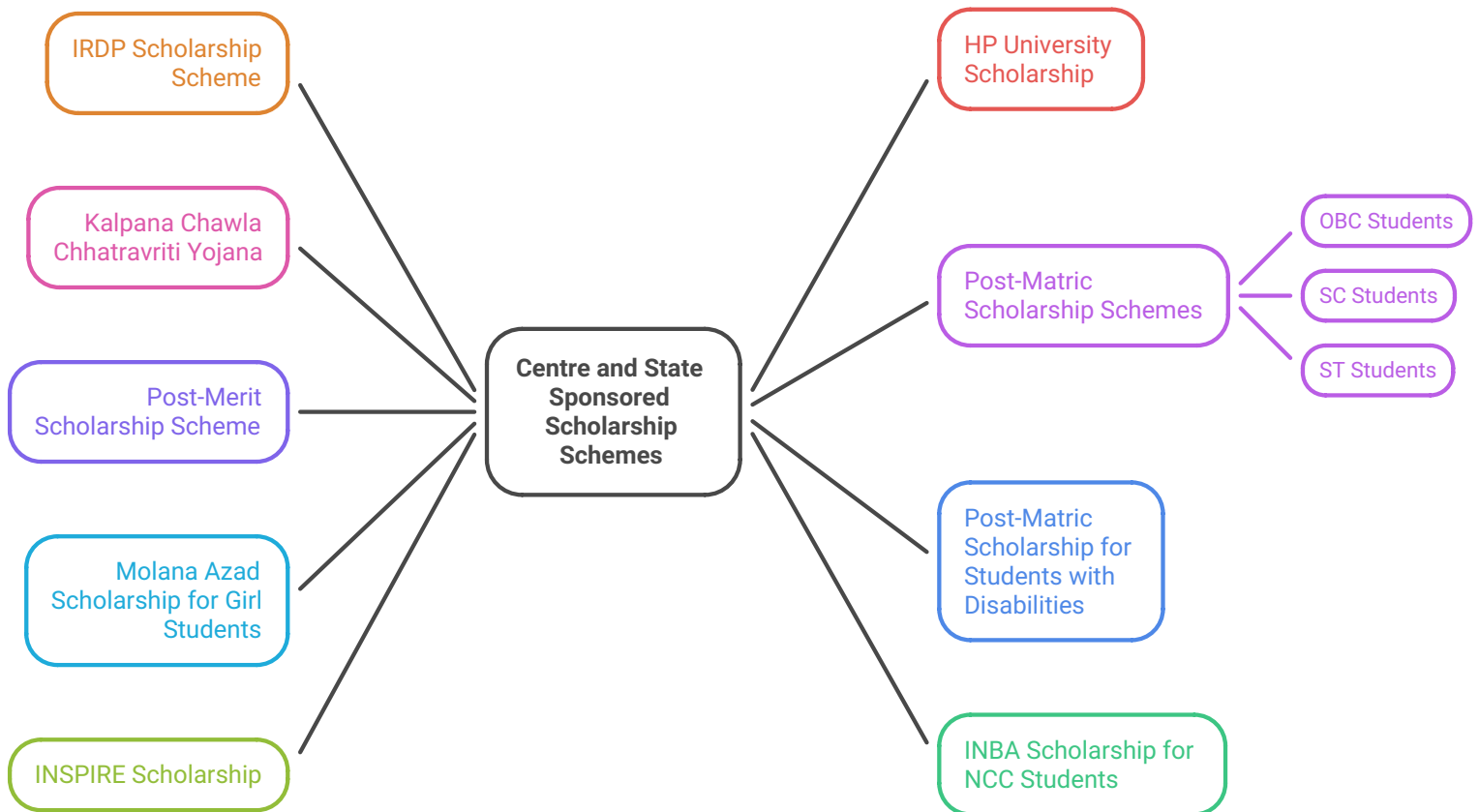

Breaking college furniture, doors, windows, etc. is a violation.

Unauthorized Outsiders

Bringing outsiders to the college campus is prohibited.

Electrical Interference

Interfering with electrical wiring/appliances is dangerous.

Vandalism

Writing or defacing walls and blackboards is a violation.

Eve-Teasing

Eve-teasing is a serious offense and will not be tolerated.

Smoking and Intoxicants

Smoking, use of Gutka, or any intoxicant is prohibited.

IDENTITY CARD / LIBRARY CARD

- ❖ Every student must carry the **Identity Card-cum-Library Card** while attending the college.
- ❖ The card is an important document and should be produced whenever required by the college authorities.
- ❖ In case of loss of the card, the student must submit an application to the **Principal**.
- ❖ A **duplicate Identity Card-cum-Library Card** will be issued on payment of **₹30**.
- ❖ Students should collect their Identity Card-cum-Library Card from the **Librarian** as per the schedule notified by the Library.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

- 📖 Library books are issued on all working days from **10:00 AM to 4:00 PM**.
- 📖 Students must present their **Library Card** for issuing books.
- 📖 A maximum of **two books** may be issued at a time for a period of **14 days**.
- 📖 **Reference books, dictionaries, newspapers, and periodicals** are not issued.
- 📖 A fine of **₹5 per book per day** will be charged for late return of books.
- 📖 Damage to a library book will attract a fine of **₹50**, in addition to the cost of the book.
- 📖 Failure to return books or pay the prescribed fine shall invite recovery proceedings as per Government rules.

LEAVE RULES

- Leave applications must be recommended by the concerned teacher(s).
- Leave up to **three days** may be sanctioned by the **Senior Tutor/Subject Teacher**.
- Leave exceeding **three days** will be sanctioned by the **Principal**.

RE-ADMISSION

- ✓ A student remaining absent from any class for **six consecutive days without sanctioned leave** will have his/her name struck off the college rolls.
- ✓ A student absent for **ten days or more in a month** will also be removed from the rolls.
- ✓ Re-admission may be granted by the **Principal** on payment of a **re-admission fee of ₹100** within **seven days** of removal from the rolls.
- ✓ After seven days, a **re-admission fee of ₹200** will be charged.
- ✓ Re-admission is subject to the recommendation of the concerned teachers and the Principal may impose an additional fine, if deemed necessary.
- ✓ A student whose name is struck off the rolls **for the second time in the same academic session** will not be eligible for re-admission.
