

RAGGING IS A CRIMINAL OFFENCE

Ragging is a punishable offence. Ragging of all kind is strictly banned in the college campus. Anybody caught indulging in this evil exercise shall face penalty under the law. Act remotely suggestive of ragging should be reported to the college authorities/to the member of anti ragging committee. A student who commits the offence of ragging shall be **punishable with imprisonment for a term**, which may extend to **three years** or shall also be liable to a fine, which may extend to **Rs. 50,000 or both**.

In order to have zero tolerance and its total elimination from the educational institutions *Hon'ble Supreme Court of India* vide its orders dated 4th May, 2001; 16th May, 2007 and 11th Feb. 2009 has directed as under:

-Ragging is banned in the institution. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh. Punishment for ragging includes:

- > Imprisonment, fine or both.
- > Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology.
- > Withholding scholarship or other benefits.
- > Debarring from representation in events.
- > Withholding of results.
- > Suspension of expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) FOR UNDERGRADUATE (UG) COURSES

The Himachal Pradesh University vide Letter No. 2-1/2012 H.P.U. (Academic) dated 4 June 2016 has notified the acceptance of the latest course curriculum under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) brought out by the University Grant Commission for implementation from academic session 2019-20.

Outlines of Choice Based Credit System:

- **1. Core Course:** (12 for general courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com.
- **2. Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- **2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE):** (2 each for regular courses): An elective course offered under the main discipline/ subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
- **2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course:** (2 each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective.
- **3.Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). –AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement; (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/Hindi/MIL Communication/Sanskrit. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
- **3.1Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, EnglishCommunication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication/ Sanskrit.
- **3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

AGE LIMIT FOR ADMISSION TO UG COURSES

For admission to the 1st Year, a student must not be more than *23 Years* (25 Years for girls) of age on 1st July 2025, e.g. the applicant should not be born earlier than 01/07/2002 in case of boys and 01/07/2000 in case of girls. However, in respect of SC and ST students a relaxation of 3 years is given.

The *Vice-Chancellor* of HPU Shimla has the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months. All such cases could provisionally be granted age relaxation upto six months by the *Principal* and a consolidated list of such cases be sent for approval of the Vice-Chancellor. A candidate who has availed age relaxation at the time of first admission shall be eligible for the same in the subsequent classes also.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Candidate must pass the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent there to by the various bodies of the H. P. University:

- (1) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. / B.C.A. program.
- (2) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com.
- (3) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with mathematics as one of the subjects shall be given preference in admission to B.C.A. program.
- (4) Admission is purely on *merit basis*. Rounding of fraction of marks is permissible as per norms.

MIGRATION RULES

Migration from other colleges to this college and vice-versa is governed by HP University Rules. A migration certificate can be issued only if the student is registered with the HP University.

The students may go for a job or become an entrepreneur, or continue studying for the M. Voc. or they can take admission in any other Master Programmes.
- ✓ The students can appear in **any competitive exams across the country** i.e. conducted by State Public Service Commission and Union Public Service Commission.
- ✓ Job oriented skill development training programmes.
- ✓ Placement Assistance through well established vibrant placement cell.
- ✓ A maximum of *45 students* will be admitted to B.Voc. Programme.

Eligibility Conditions

Admission to the B Voc. Programme will be as per the rules and regulations of the Himachal Pradesh University followed for all Undergraduate Programmes (UG).

About the Bachelor of Vocation (B. Voc.) Degree Programme

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a scheme on skill development based job oriented higher education program as a part of College/University education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) degree. This degree Program is unique with the provision of multiple entry and exist at different levels of NSQF from level 5 to 7, viz. Diploma/Advance Diploma and Degree in compliance to the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF). Multiple entry and exit will allow students the flexibility to earn and study as per their convenience.

Mode of Selection

GRADUATE ADD-ON PROGRAMME

This training programme will train 2,000 students in selected sectors viz., BFSI, Electronics, IT-ITES, Beauty and Wellness, Apparel & Made Ups Sectors. Further, Indian Institute of Skill Development (IISD) has been selected to provide training in the aforesaid sectors in academic year 2022-23. Project sponsor for 2022-23 was Asian Development Bank and Project Team of Technopak Advisor Pvt. Ltd has provided training for Merchandiser Course to 120 students in 4 batches.

Students of BA/ BSc/BCom/ BCA & B.Voc. final year are eligible for these add on programme.

ADD-ON CERTIFICATE COURSES

In order to enhance the job readiness of our students the college has started various Add-on Certificate Courses. The main objective of these courses is to provide an opportunity to do an employment oriented/ skill based course to each and every student of the college. Our experienced teachers have designed these 30 hrs courses which have special relevance to each subject. In the session 2022-23 two certificate courses in -GST & Income Tax e-Filling and -Computer Skills & Office Automation have successfully completed.

COLLEGE HOSTEL

The college provided hostel facility for **50 Girls students** of *UG courses* and **5 seats** are reserved for the girls of *PG courses*. The seats available are limited. Girls Students desirous of seeking hostel accommodation may apply for these seats after their admission to the college has been secured. *Application form* can be obtained from the *hostel warden/office*.

PROCEDURE FOR SEAT ALLOTMENT

This hostel is meat for only **SC/ST Girls**. However, **General Category** girls may also get accommodation depending upon the availability of seats. Girls who were residing in the hostel in the previous academic session are given preference unless they fail in the *Annual Examination*. Other applicants will be allotted seats on the basis of merit in the previous academic session. If the seats still remain vacant, they will be filled on the *first come first serve basis*.

DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT

The Principal has power to take disciplinary action against student indulging in acts of indiscipline, which may lead to fine, suspension, rustication or expulsion.

The following activities will be considered as violation of the college discipline and may result in fine\ expulsion or rustication depending on the gravity of the offence:

- ➤ Violence, use of force and ragging.
- Making noise and disturbing classes.
- ➤ Breaking college furniture, doors, windows, etc.
- > Bringing outsider to the college campus.
- ➤ Interfering with electrical wiring/appliances.
- Writing / defacing walls and blackboards.
- Eve-teasing
- Smoking, use of *Gutka* or any intoxicant.

Playing Songs/ Music on mobile phones in the campus is strictly prohibited and any violation of this instruction will be considered act of indiscipline.

IDENTITY CARD / LIBRARY CARD

Identity Card cum Library Card is an important document a student must carry every day. In case of loss of Card, an application to the Principal alongwith payment of Rs 30/- duplicate I-Card will be issued. I-Card and Library Card should be collected from the Librarian as per schedule notified by the librarian.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The issuance of the books is between 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM on all working days. A student must bring his/her library card to get the books issued in his/her name. Only two books are issued to a student at a time for a period of 14 days. Reference Books/ Dictionaries/ Newspapers/ Periodicals will not be issued. If the issued books are not returned by due date, a fine at the rate of Rs. 1 per book per day will be charged. Internal damage to a book will invite a fine of Rs. 50/-in addition to recovery of cost of the book. Failure to return the book or to pay the penalty imposed will entail the same procedure for recovery as in the case of recovery of govt. property.

LEAVE RULES

- > Students should get their leave applications recommended by the teachers.
- Leave for **3 days** will be sanctioned by the senior tutors / subject teacher.
- Leave for more than **3 days** will be sanctioned by the Principal.

RE-ADMISSION

The students **absent for 6 days** continuously from any class without proper sanctioning of leave by the **competent authority of the college**, his/ her name automatically will be struck off from the rolls. A student **absent for 10 days** in a month will also be deleted from rolls. Readmission will be entertained on payment of *readmission fee of Rs. 100/-* within **7 days** after duly permitted by the Principal. After expiry of 7 days the student will have to bear a *re-admission fee of Rs. 200/-*. The recommendation of the teacher and in addition to it, the Principal may impose extra fine depending upon the gravity of his/her absence. A student struck off for the second time in a session from any class will be ineligible for re-admission to the class.

COLLEGE STUDENTS CENTRAL ASSOCIATION (CSCA)

The College Students Central Association is formed every year as per the rules laid down by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla from time to time. Presently the selection for various posts of this association is done through merit i.e. indirect selection mode.

PARENT TEACHERS ASSOCIATION (PTA)

It also exhibits a panoramic summary of year-long activities in the form of pictography.

ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION

Various awards and prizes are given to the meritorious students in academics and to those who *excel in sports and co-curricular activities* on the Annual Prize Distribution Function as per college norms.

CAREER GUIDANCE & COUNSELING CELL

Career guidance cell guides the students regarding different career prospects open to them. Clippings of advertisements for different posts/training programs from various newspapers are also displayed on the notice board for the benefit of students. Resource persons from different fields are also invited for career related guidance and counseling of the students.

IGNOU CENTRE

Our IGNOU study Centre is running various educational programs at a reasonable fee. All IGNOU courses are recognized by the UGC. The college students can simultaneously do any of the Degree/Diploma Programs from IGNOU because the migration certificate is not required for doing any course form IGNOU. OLD STUDENTS ASSOCIATION (OSA)

Old Student's Association (OSA) of Dr. Y. S. Parmar, Govt. P. G. College, Nahan is a registered association of college which came into existence in 2001, since then it is an active body with many alumni as its members. The college conducts meetings time to time with the members of Old Student's Association (OSA) which provides a platform to the former students to contribute suggestions with respect to the functioning and infrastructure of the college.

RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IN THE COLLEGE

CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
